ORDER:

In the reference 2<sup>nd</sup> read above, the Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare), Hyderabad has furnished proposals for laying of Road works in the Scheduled Area under RIDF-X (Rural Infrastructure Development Fund) with an estimated cost of Rs.10231.30 lakhs and the same has been sent to NABARD for their consideration and sanction of funds.

2. In the references 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> read above, NABARD has conveyed their approval and sanctioned loan for 45 Rural Roads and Bridges as per the details given below:

3. The year-wise allocation of State Government contribution for 45 Rural Road and Bridge Projects (Tribal Areas) is Rs.923.28 is as follows:

4. After careful consideration of the proposal of the Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare), Government hereby accord administrative sanction for Rs.4201.30 lakhs (i.e., NABARD share Rs.3278.02 lakhs and State share Rs.923.28 lakhs). The district-wise details of the works are shown in the Annexure I.
5. The Chief Engineer, Tribal Welfare, A.P., Hyderabad is authorized to execute the works specified in the Annexure appended to this order. The Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare) shall commence the works from April 2004 onwards and complete well before 31<sup>st</sup> March 2007.
6. The expenditure shall be debited to the Head of Account "M.H. 4225-02 Welfare of STs M.H. 800 - Other expenditure G.H. 07 Rural Infrastructure Development Fund S.H (76) Rural Water Supply Projects under NABARD programmes - 530 Major Works - 531 Other Expenditure".
7. All concerned shall undertake frequent monitoring and quality control tests as prescribed and as per the instructions contained in the relevant codes, manuals and Government Orders/Circulars etc. The findings of the respective officers on the quality, the quality control tests and compliance thereto etc., shall be retained on record follow up and made available to NABARD whenever they require. NABARD has the power to inspect any work and to verify the records concerned.
8. The special terms and conditions are enclosed herewith as Annexure-II for taking necessary action accordingly.
9. Whenever the VTDA's / Village Organizations are entrusted with the execution, they shall necessarily be given training preferably at a nearby work site of a similar scheme or at the work site explaining the highlights of the work with special reference to quality parameters so as to ensure proper execution of the scheme. The Superintending Engineers/Executive Engineers must also organize training to the field level staff so that they in turn impart the training to the VTDA's / Women organizations concerned.
10. In the event of any substandard execution and poor quality construction both the executing agency and the concerned staff involved in the execution including supervisory staff are liable for stringent action.
11. In addition to training the executing agencies, the women organizations along with the active youth representatives shall also be given an orientation training before the commencement of the work, so as to ensure transparency and the involvement of the local people in the implementation and subsequent maintenance of the scheme. The representatives nominated by them should be given training in a similar manner in minor repairs and maintenance of the schemes at similarly placed defunct/on going schemes so as to enable them to gain practical knowledge and skills.
12. The Commissioner of Tribal Welfare, A.P., Hyderabad and Project Officers I.T.D.As shall accordingly monitor the progress of works on monthly basis and furnish report to the Government and NABARD.
13. The Commissioner of Tribal Welfare, A.P., Hyderabad/Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare) are requested to take necessary action accordingly and to make budgetary provisions during the Financial year 2005-06 and 2006-2007 to meet the State Government contribution for smooth implementation of the above said 45 projects as mentioned in para 3.
14. If the Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare), Hyderabad is able to execute the projects ahead of the physical targets/phasing period, funds will be released on the basis of actual works.
15. The Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare), Hyderabad shall utilize the loan amount solely and exclusively for the purpose for which it was sanctioned by the NABARD as well as Government contribution. He has no right/authority to divert the funds sanctioned under the above scheme.

16. The Chief Engineer (Tribal Welfare), Hyderabad shall fulfill/perform all the formalities and comply with the General Terms and Conditions as prescribed in the Schedule - I separately communicated to him and also the special terms and conditions in respect of Rural Road Project in Andhra Pradesh (Tribal Areas), in addition to taking all measures possible to ensure proper execution/maintenance while maintaining quality and standards as prescribed.
